Leipzig, Sachsen - The 47th edition of the Leipziger Jazztage will take place this year from 14 to 21 October 2023. Under the motto "Make the connection", over 100 artists from all corners of the globe will come together at various venues in the city over the course of eight festival days to dedicate themselves to the shared experience of music.

Invited are artists from countries like the USA, Japan, Armenia, Great Britain, Poland, France, Congo, Switzerland, Greece, Korea, Ukraine, Sweden, Iran, Brazil and many more. Especially after the restrictions of the last few years and in view of current regional as well as global political developments, it is of immense importance to lift the gaze and (re)establish the connections ,to the outside'. In many of the bands presented,

artists from different backgrounds work together, drawing on the richness of their diverse cultural references.

Together with them, we ask ourselves: Is there understanding and unity or friction and disharmony? Do we move towards each other or do we insist on our own position to the last note? How can one connect one's own present with the traditions of the past and make them accessible to others? How boring would life and art be if nothing unexpected were allowed in, if one remained in eternal self-congratulation as in eternal standstill?

Tom Skinner »Voices of Bishara«

Tom Skinner - known as the drummer of Sons of Kemet and The Smile, among others - comes to Leipzig with his own band. The title of his debut album under his own name "Voices of Bishara" makes a reference to the solo album "By my self" by cellist Abdul Wadud, which was released on his own label "Bisharra" in 1978. Tom Skinner listened to this album continuously during the lockdown. "Bishara" is the more common spelling of the frequently used Arabic name, which can be translated as ,good news' or ,bringer of good news'. London sound with an unusual line-up.

Eric Schaefer's Ensemble Hayashi

A collaboration between classically trained and improvising musicians who are inspired by the special way of making music in Nō theatre in Eric Schaefer's composition ,HAYASHI'. Japanese Nō 能 is the oldest living theatre form. It has a compositional structure that on the one hand gives the performers exact specifications, but on the other hand has self-determined spaces and fuzziness that open up to improvisation. Eric Schaefer's composition is based on this modus operandi and seeks a dialogue between musical cultures. On the final evening, the interdisciplinary collaboration of Ensemble Hayashi with the dancer Ichi-Go and the visual artist Acci Baba will be premiered at Oper Leipzig.

Tigran Hamasyan »The Call Within«

In a unique way, Tigran Hamasyan combines jazz with post-rock and the rich musical tradition of his home country Armenia: a vibrating music in which polyrhythms, odd time signatures and breathless tempos alternate with calmer, poetic, ethereal phases. As usual, Tigran Hamasyan uses his own voice to counterbalance the electrifying streams of sound. Themes that have inspired his compositions include Christian and pre-Christian folk legends from his homeland, poetry, astrology, cave art, ancient design, geometry and cartography.
